

TOWN OF LEICESTER
TOWN BOARD WORK MEETING
TUESDAY, APRIL 12, 2016

The work meeting of the Leicester Town Board was held on Tuesday, April 12, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at the Leicester Town Hall.

Present: Dave Fanaro, Town Supervisor; Karen Roffe, Jerry Hull, Joni Santucci, Council Members; Russell Page Highway Superintendent; Councilperson Matt Durbin excused.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor Fanaro.

Karen Roffe was appointed to complete meeting minutes.

Highway Superintendent Page presented to the Board the Department of Transportation CHIPS budget for 2016-2017. The Town of Leicester will receive \$135,906.26 for the budget year. Superintendent Page discussed the projected Town road projects for 2016 and identified the amount of CHIPS money that could be used for each project.

Highway Superintendent Page informed the Board that the road signs located on Barratt Road have two different spellings of Barratt. One sign is spelled Barratt and the other is spelled Barrett. The Board agreed that the signs needed to be changed. The official spelling will be Barratt Road. The change will be made by Resolution at the Town Board meeting.

The Supervisor Fanaro discussed the following topics:

- 1) Salt Storage Building – The site work will start soon and once the site is ready the building will be finished in three or four weeks.
- 2) Income Surveys – The surveys have been mailed and after three weeks a “door to door” survey will be made to those properties that did not respond.
- 3) Brine Plant – The Attorney has reviewed the Abstracts. The Board will visit the site to approve the land survey.
- 4) Lawn mowing bids – The Town received five bids for the 2016 mowing season. Supervisor Fanaro opened the bids and the Board reviewed them. The Board requested additional information. The Bid will be awarded at the Town Board meeting.

A motion was made by Joni Santucci and seconded by Jerry Hull to adjourn at 8: 24 p.m. Motion carried Ayes 4, Noes 0.
